What is our Vision?

Each citizen of Dundee will have access to the information and support that they need to live a fulfilled life.

How do we know what we need to do?

When writing the plan, we considered important things such as:

- What we have done since our last plan and what we still need to do.
- Information about the health and social care needs of people who live in Dundee.
- What people living in Dundee have told us is important.
- The important role of carers and how we support them.
- The views of our workforce and our partners.
- How our work fits into plans of other services.
- The things the Scottish Government and UK Government tell us that we need to do especially those set out in law.

What do we know about people in Dundee?

We know that people in Dundee have many strengths. There are strong communities with people and families who are resilient. We know that there are some challenges to overcome. Too many people have poor health and some people die too young. We want everyone to have the same life chances and to have good access to health and care. We want to make a difference to everyone in Dundee by supporting those who are most in need.

What are we are going to do?

Over the next three years we will continue to do the things which are working well. We have 4 main things we want to work on improving.

Strategic Priority 1



Health Inequalities

We want everyone to have the best health and wellbeing they can have. There should be not be any difference between people who live in different areas of the city or have different circumstances.

Strategic Priority 2



Early Intervention and Prevention

We will have the best community based supports. We want people to have support sooner and stay healthy.

Strategic Priority 3



Locality Working and Engaging with Communities

We will provide services and supports as close to home as possible and respond to the specific needs of local communities.

Strategic Priority 4



Models of Support, Pathways of Care

We will have community based, person centred services which work together to help people live independently at home for longer.

The Plan has information about how identifying, listening to, including and supporting Carers is an important part of our work. We also know that Digital Technology is one way of using our resources well and supporting people.

The Plan says how the Partnership manages its money. We are committed to making the best use of resources and have a three year financial framework to help us do this.

We want services and supports to be person centred. Health and Social Care services will be provided as close to people as they can be to help people get the right support at the right time. Services will follow the 8 local community planning partnership areas in Dundee. Maryfield; East End; Strathmartine; Lochee; The Ferry; North East; West End; and Coldside.

- More detailed information about people who live in Dundee and their health and social care needs.
- Plans to help more people get the right house or place to stay in Dundee.
- Plans about learning and development opportunities for our workforce to make sure people get the best service
